





#### 3. Distribution of Editorial Board Members




56 JECCM editorial board members come from 20 countries, among who there are 29% from the USA, followed by Italy, Belgium and Germany etc.






### 4. Number of Published Articles in 2018 (results by month)




## 5. Diverse Types of Articles Published in 2018



In 2018, JECCM has published a total of 109 articles, among which there are 34 Editorials, 30 Review Articles, 11 Case Reports and 10 Original Articles.


### 6. International Diversity of Corresponding Authors in 2018



## Non-O1/Non-O139 Vibrio cholera bacteremia in a patient with autoimmune liver disease

A 54-year-old female with autoimmune liver disease (Child-Pugh class C, cirrhosis) was admitted to our hospital for liver transplantation. She became febrile to 40.1 °C the next day. Both anaerobic and aerobic blood culture detected gram-negative bacilli at 9 h. On subculture, beta-haemolytic mucoid colonies could be found in 5% sheep blood agar plates and grey moist colonies could be detected in chocolate agar plate.




### Relapsing polychondritis restricted to respiratory tract

The decolonization strategy is gradually applied in intensive care unit (ICU) through the years. 




